Goals of Dual Enrollment

- ★ High School Graduation
- ★ College-level credit attainment
- ★ Preparing students to choose majors
- ★ Conversion of Dual Enrollment students to become degree-seeking students
- ★ College/ University Graduation
- ★ Reduced College Cost

College Life Expectations

Eligibility *versus* Readiness

Points to consider:

- ★ student's **maturity** level
- ★ academic **rigor** of college classes
- ★ choosing a class with a certain **major** in mind
- ★ **initiative** in college classes vs high school

Looking Beyond GPA ...

Let's assess the student's readiness...

- ★ Disorganized
- ★ Perfectionist
- ★ Easily overwhelmed
- ★ Unassertive
- ★ Unwilling to ask for help
- ★ Procrastinator
- ★ High need parents

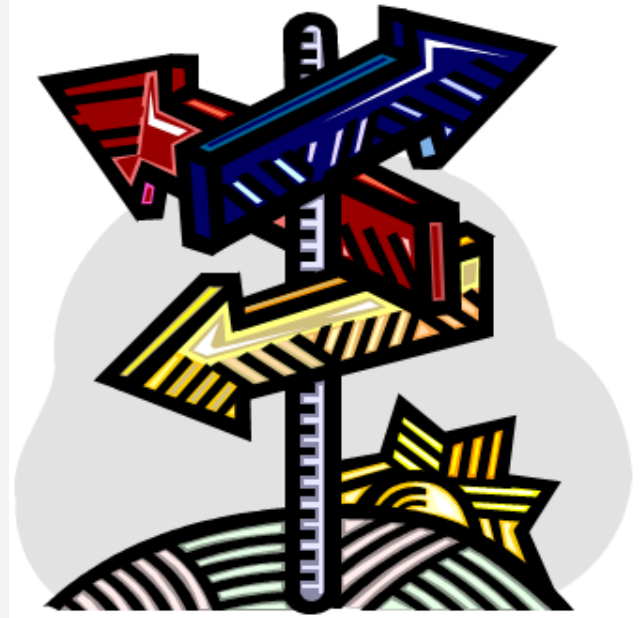
Student Behavior...

- ★ Attendance

Dual Enrollment and Advanced Placement

Dual Enrollment (Dual Enrollment) and Advanced Placement (AP):

- Top colleges want to see the student take the most rigorous courses available.
 - **AP > Dual Enrollment > Honors > CP**
 - No added points for Dual Enrollment
- Dual Enrollment and AP are available options to receive college credit.





Hs Student Procedures

Dual Enrollment Procedures

Students must follow the steps below if he/ she is planning to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program:

1. Student and Parent must attend a Dual Enrollment Informational Night.
2. Take SAT or ACT or ACCUPLACER (if required/ recommended for admission)
3. Apply to and be accepted by the college/ university of the student's choice.
4. Student completes the Student Participation Agreement (SPA) and GAFutures Funding Application online (gafutures.org).
5. Student Participation Agreement must be signed by the Counselor.

Dual Enrollment Procedures

6. Student registers for Dual Enrollment classes based on courses approved by the counselor on the Student Participation Agreement.
7. Obtain a copy of college schedule and give a copy to the school counselor as soon as it becomes available.
8. At the end of the semester, provide the college/ university **official transcript** to your high school counselor.
9. Repeat steps 4 – 9 for second semester. ***

ACCUPLACER

- ACCUPLACER test can be used as a substitute for the SAT/ ACT at Gwinnett Technical College.
 - Placement test over 4 subject areas.
 - Can be taken at Gwinnett Technical College on walk-in basis.

Dual Enrollment Contract is Required

ALL students enrolled in Dual Enrollment course(s) MUST have attended with parent the Dual Enrollment Information session and have signed the Dual Enrollment Contract / Student Participation Agreement.



Return and Sign...



Students/ Parents:

Attend Dual Enrollment Information session, return the signed forms
(Contract/ SPA/ Transportation)

Counselors will verify the courses are aligned with requirements to graduate (as well as graduation plan)

Check with your counselor for the following:

- A. Scheduling conferences with counselors to review SPA document, **after receiving college acceptance.**
- B. Making sure High School/ College schedule is correct if you're part-time.
- C. School related important information and dates.

Dual Enrollment Procedures

Course Credit:

1 semester in a college course is equivalent to 1 year in a high school course. Make sure you do not fail any classes because it may delay graduation.

Dual Enrollment Enroll and Withdraw

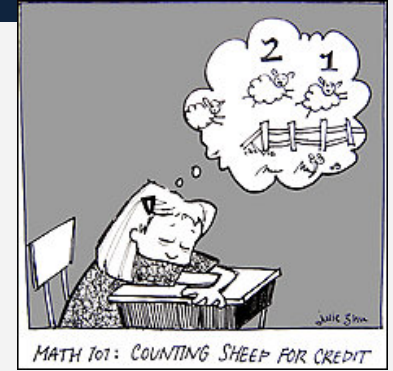
Counselor approval is REQUIRED prior to enrollment and withdrawal from any Dual Enrollment course.

- Full time enrollment
- High School/ College deadlines for schedule changes
- Correct courses to meet graduation requirements

Contract

Full - Time Enrollment Required

1. **Full Time** - all classes at the college.
 - a. 4 - 5 classes
 - b. 12- 15 credit hours MAX.



2. **Combination** of high school and Dual Enrollment
 - a. 6 different classes

Students can't drop below full time status

Student Participation Agreement

Full - Time Enrollment Required

- MUST BE COMPLETED EVERY SEMESTER!
- Back of Page 2 - Course Plan:
 - Students are responsible for making sure they are meeting any graduation requirements.

Student Participation Agreement

Full - Time Enrollment Required

- Course Examples:

- 12th Literature (Brit Lit.) = ENGL 110 1 – Lit & Comp
- Economics = ECON 110 1 – Intro to Economics
- Political Systems = POLS 110 1 – American Government
- College Math = MATH 1111 – College Algebra
- Senior Science Elective = PHSC 1111 – Physical Science

You do not need to complete all requirements in ONE semester

Transportation



- Sign the Transportation Agreement */F*you are enrolling **part-time** and need transportation during the school day. We provide transportation to Gwinnett Tech!
- It is *your* responsibility to schedule your college classes in between the bus pick-up and drop-off times.

Students can't drop below full time status!

Must have 6 different classes!

Funding Application

Dual Enrollment Procedures

The Dual Enrollment online (www.gafutures.org) funding application **MUST** be completed **PRIOR** to **each semester**! This is the application so that you do not have to pay for the college classes.

1. Go to GAFutures.org.
2. Create an account if you don't already have one. **Make sure your NAME, DOB, and SSN match the high school records.**
3. Go to the Dual Enrollment page under the State Scholarships & Grants tab.
4. Complete the application. The student may have to send evidence of completion to the college.

HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship



Initial academic eligibility....

Core courses are included in the student's HOPE high school GPA for HOPE Scholarship and Zell Miller Scholarship eligibility determinations

Degree level core coursework taken as dual enrollment meets Academic Rigor requirements and are given a weight of 0.5

HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship

Postsecondary level eligibility...

Dual Credit Hours paid for by Dual Enrollment are not counted toward the Attempted Hours or Combined Attempted Hours limit for HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarship at the postsecondary level
